Dear Parents/Carers

The Governors and I would like to praise and thank our Year 6 children this week on how they conducted themselves in their SATs. They were all here bright and early for breakfast, had fun with their peers and then went calmly into the hall and did their best. We could not ask for anymore! For their hard work, the children have been treated this morning with a trip to the Priory's Cinema to watch a film. Thank you also to the Governors who came in to help our staff.

Please remember that on Monday, we have the school photographer in taking class photos together with our Year 6 leavers.

Our term ends next Friday when we will finish at 3.15 p.m. – as normal, there will be **no afterschool club** provision on this day.

After the half term, starting on Monday 2nd June – we have been notified by the School Lunch Company that the price of lunches will increase to **£2.60**. This is due to the National Minimum wage and NI increase, together with cost of food costs. They have kept it to a minimal increase and feel it still represents great value for money. ScoPay will be adjusted ready for next term's orders.

Rags2Riches will be here on Tuesday 3rd June @ 9.00 a.m. to collect any surplus clothes you may have. Please just use black bags. The company pay the school money by the weight of the bags they collect. Please use half term to sort your wardrobes and raise money for your school.

<i>You said:</i>	<i>Our response:</i>
<u>Parking</u> continues to be a problem outside school, and this is compromising safety. Can you do more about this issue?	We will put a reminder in newsletter to all about safe parking. We will contact the community police officer to help with traffic enforcement. We are putting this item on the agenda for governors to revisit.
<u>Reading records</u> – how do frequently do you listen to my child read? How do I know if you don't write it in the record.	We will discuss how we use reading records throughout the school. We will make this clearer to parents with a sheet in the front of reading records (as well as the info on the website).
<u>Clubs</u> – we appreciate the great clubs on offer but is it possible to have more advance notice for planning? Also, are there any clubs for younger children?	We will try to give as much advance warning of clubs as possible in future. We have run clubs for younger children and will do so again.

<u>DOJO / ParentMail / Communications</u> – how are different communications used by the school? Could we have some clarity about what to expect?	Mrs Veeder, Mrs Docherty and the governors are already looking at communications as a Senior Leadership Team; we look forward to providing you with more on this soon.
<u>Parent support</u> - how can parents help and support the school, practically and financially? Can you tell us more about what the school needs?	Coming along to events like these is always helpful – thank you! You can support through FoBPS. We are putting this item on the agenda for governors to consider further.

Thank you to all those parents who attended. This was a really positive and helpful meeting, and we appreciate your taking the time to talk to us. As ever, we value our stakeholders, and your feedback matters.
