As readers, we will focus on:

Phonics

These lessons will follow the Read, Write, Inc approach.

Geography

What are the countries of the UK like?

As geographers, we will develop our understanding of the United Kingdom. Children will learn all about the United Kingdom and its four countries, developing their understanding from their local environment to the UK in

general. Children will explore the location of the UK in relation to the world, its four countries, capital cities and surrounding seas.



Science—Plants

As scientists, we will:

- *identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees
- *observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.

Working scientifically skills

Changes over time: How does my sunflower change over the year? What happens to my bean when we plant it?



Comparative testing and fair testing: Which type of compost grows the tallest sunflower? Which trees have the biggest leaves?

Pattern seeking: Do bigger seeds grow into bigger plants?

Computing—Grouping Data

This unit introduces learners to data and information. We will focus on assigning data with different labels in order to demonstrate how computers are able to group and present data.

Maths


As mathematicians, we will focus on:



- *one ten is equivalent to ten ones.
- *multiples of ten can be represented using their names or using numerals.
- *counting in multiples of ten.
- *our knowledge of the 0-10 numberline and how this can be used to estimate the position of multiples of ten on a 0-100 number line.
- *adding and subtracting ten from a multiple of ten.
- *using known facts for the numbers within ten to add and subtract in multiples of ten.

PSHE—Healthy Me





- *Keeping myself clean.
- *germs, disease and illness.
- *crossing the road safely

PE

Netball– We will explore how to apply the principles of attack vs defence, with a particular focus on passing and moving. Pupils will learn how to keep possession and eventually score in order to win a modified game.

Outdoor learning—We will Introduce lashing and frapping techniques to make frames for dens. Use directional language (near and far; left and right) We will move logs safely with support first. Use of bow saw 1-1 to cut discs and peelers for whittling. Tie knots for attaching to structures and trees.
