This is to keep the tradition of The Thomas Collier Charity alive where a loaf of bread is given to the children of Burford Primary School once a year as a reminder of poverty in the past. In 1665 Thomas Collier left a legacy to buy 12 one-penny loaves each week to be distributed to families in need. Records show this continued until the turn of the 20th century.

## Quidditch Event

On Wednesday, the children were taught how to play Quidditch. Traditionally, Quidditch is a dangerous sport played by witches and wizards riding on their flying broomsticks. In the absence of flying broomsticks, the children had to use their feet and to avoid unnecessary health and safety paperwork, the game was slightly modified. First, the children practised throwing a soft black ball (bludger) at each other. To make the game harder, the children then had to shoot a soft golden ball (quaffle) through a hoop, whilst avoiding being hit by the bludger. To end the session, which was my favourite part, the children had to chase the Golden Snitch – which was one of their class adults. At the end of the day, there was a whole school assembly to announce the winners!
