Absent from School?

If your child is absent from school for any reason, please don't forget to let us know. Absences are recorded in our registers with the appropriate reason code, i.e illness, medical appointment etc. Where no reason is given the absence is recorded as "unauthorised" and may be investigated by the Educational Welfare Officer.

QUICK REMINDERS

- * There will be a one-way system into school using the school's side gate to enter and the playground gate to exit. Please drop off and exit promptly gates open at 8.30 a.m.
- ➤ Breakfast Club children must be brought to the front entrance at 7.45 am where they will be met by a member of staff.
- * After School Provision when arriving to collect your child/ren please ring the intercom at the front door and a member of staff will bring your child/ren to you.



Parking Around School

As we are at the start of a new term, please may we remind parents to respect our neighbours when parking near the school by not blocking drives, gateways, and keeping clear of the zig-zag lines. The bus parking spaces should also be kept clear for buses/coaches — especially at the end of the school day. As previously advised, the Police do monitor the parking situation and you may be fined if you are not parking safely.





Hot School Lunches are with The School Lunch Company and our lovely Mrs Edwards (Martha & Hettie's Mummy) is our Catering Manager. You can book via SCOPAY – this has to be done by the <u>Wednesday</u> ready for the following week please so that Mrs Edwards can place her orders for delivery on Fridays. Please remind your child of their menu choice every day as this will fasten up the serving. Lunches are free of charge for all children in Year R to Year 2 and if you are eligible for free school meals. For older pupils, these can be purchased at the new rate of £2.40 through SCOPAY. Children can also bring in their own healthy packed lunch if you prefer. We are a strict nut free school so please look at the labels before sending them into school.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS - Children whose parents/carers receive the following support payments may be entitled to receive free school meals and the school may receive extra funding.

- Income support/Employment support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Support under the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension
- Child Tax Credit providing that Working Tax Credit in not included and that the annual income for Tax Credit purposes is within the guideline set for the financial year.

If you feel this applies to you, then please speak to Mrs Hunt in the office. She will require your name, date of birth and NI number to carry out the eligibility check.

HEALTHY EATING - Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are given a healthy snack daily. Year 3 to 6 children may bring in a healthy snack of fruit/vegetables, if they wish.

WATER BOTTLES - Just a quick reminder that all children should bring a water bottle to school each day. Water bottles (with a sports style top) can be kept in class for continuous use during the day. We recommend the bottles be named!

COMMUNICATION – School communication is via an App called ParentMail. All parents should be registered and all new parents will have received an invitation to register.

MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

If your child has a medical condition or allergy e.g asthma, that may require inhalers, or antibiotics to treat infections during school hours, then please drop off the medication into the school office and complete the medical consent form. All medicines should be named appropriately.

PLEASE NOTE that if your child has unfortunately had sickness and/or diarrhoea the recommended period by the Health Protection Agency & the School Nurse, is for children to be kept away from school is <u>48 hours</u> from the last episode of diarrhoea and/or vomiting. Children in all classes are expected to have their PE kits in school all week. PE kits should be taken home over the weekend for washing, but please make sure it's back in school on Monday morning. No football kits may be worn for PE lessons.

May we remind parents that all children are expected to wear school uniform with suitable school shoes (no trainers or opentoed sandals) and long hair must be tied back for health and safety reasons. Children are not permitted to wear nail varnish or makeup.

Children will also need to bring their coats to school in the winter and sunhats in the summer as, wherever possible, we like the children to play outside at morning break and lunchtimes.
