This week the children attended a special annual assembly hosted by the Deputy Town Mayor representing Burford's Collier Charity – all the children were given a freshly baked bread roll. (Some may have not made it home!!) This is to keep the tradition of The Thomas Collier Charity alive where a loaf of bread is given to the children of Burford Primary School once a year as a reminder of poverty in the past. In 1665 Thomas Collier left a legacy to buy 12 one-penny loaves each week to be distributed to families in need. Records show this continued until the turn of the 20th century.
