British Values are our current assembly theme this term. This week, we focused on Tolerance and the importance of accepting and celebrating diversity. We considered why everyone has a right to be respected regardless of gender, identity, race, religion, culture and nationality. Each week we will be using a range of age appropriate fiction and non-fiction books to help us to discuss important issues sensitively and in a safe space. In our whole school assembly on Monday, I read "The Proudest Blue: A story of Hijab and Family" written by Olympic medalist and social justice activist Ibtihaj Muhammed. It is the true story of two Muslim sisters on the first day of hijab and what she encounters from those around her. Stories provide a great entry point for discussion opportunities on subjects that can affect all of us.
