Town Council Playground Project

Thank you for all for your continued support with our playground project. The Crowdfunder page has now closed and, together with monies donated directly to the Town Council, we have raised over £25,000. This is an incredible amount, and we are hugely grateful to everyone who has contributed.

The Town Council met at the start of July to assess the plans and details provided by two playground companies. Both of the designs were based on the information provided by respondents to the online consultation and at the Eco Day in March. After much discussion and deliberation, the Council have chosen to work with a playground specialist company called Proludic. The picture below gives a better idea of what we hope to achieve. There is also a QR code which will take you on a virtual tour of the design. A paper copy is available to view at the council office and we have also posted it on our Facebook page. Please take a look; we really hope you like the plan but do let us know if you have any concerns.

Now that we have chosen our supplier, we can apply for a National Lottery grant, and this is being done at the moment. We are not sure yet when construction will start, but we hope the playground will be finished by next spring. Fundraising will continue throughout the summer. We are also planning to organise a Race Night at the Bowls Club on October 7th. It promises to be a fabulous evening so please put it in your diary and come and support us. We will let you know the details at the start of September.
