

Understanding the World

Whole School Assemblies - Aspirations

Expressive Arts and Design

Forest School Art - Colour mixing Make use of props and materials available for role play

Explore materials freely to create own models, making decisions on tools and methods.

Communication and Language Nursery & Reception

Focussed listening.

Enjoy listening to stories, talking about them and recalling events. Repeat words or phrases from familiar stories and Role play with friends. Use wider range of vocabulary, including new vocabulary taught.

Develop repertoire of songs and rhymes. Weekly book talk sessions and class shows. Role Play area – will change weekly to reflect focus text.

Physical Development Nursery & Reception

This term will have a gymnastics focus – travelling high and low and using the apparatus. Weekly Paddock School sessions.

Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils. Show a preference for a dominant hand. Name writing.

Support / develop independent skills such as toileting, eating and managing buttons & zips Bikes and trikes / explore outdoor areas Show accuracy when drawing Manage personal hygiene

Nursery & Reception

Enjoy making marks freely
Attribute meaning to the marks they make
Listening games, songs and rhymes
Recognise & write own name
Draw with increased accuracy
Make labels, using early print knowledge in play.
Reception

Learn set 1/2 sounds using Read, Write, Inc Learn letter formation rhymes, write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed. Spell words by identifying sounds in them and representing the sounds with correct grapheme in line with phonic knowledge Pencil grip

Write simple phrases that can be understood by themselves and others in line with phonic knowledge – speech bubbles for the Gingerbread Man, messages from the Three little Pigs

Maths Nursery & Reception

Sing number rhymes & count in play Subitise to 3

Cardinal principle & correspondence to 5 Ordinality of numbers to 5

Sing number rhymes and count in everyday play Use of manipulatives such as Numicon to show understanding of number

Link numeral to amount – 1:1 correspondence Finger counting

Comparing numbers more/less/same Build with blocks and notice patterns

Reception

Subitise to 6 and link to numeral Play dice games

Counting, ordinality and cardinality of numbers to 10. The purpose of counting.
