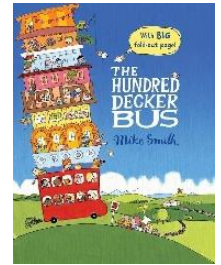
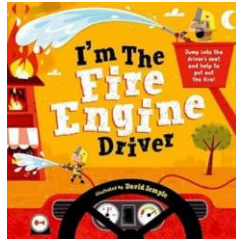

Nursery & Reception

Enjoy listening to stories and talking about them
Focussed listening
Use wider range of vocabulary, including new vocabulary taught
Role play with friends
Express a point of view
Develop reciprocal conversation
Talk about our families and special people in our lives

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Being Me!

Settling into our new class
Establish class rules
Taking turns and sharing with our new friends
Begin to recognise and manage own feelings
What are good learning behaviours?

Expressive Arts and Design Learn to sing nursery rhymes and action songs. To know the stories of some of the nursery rhymes. To learn that music can touch your feelings. To enjoy moving to music by dancing, marching, being animals or Pop stars! Self-portraits.

Physical Development

Nursery & Reception

Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils. Show a preference for a dominant hand. Name writing.
Support / develop independent skills such as toileting, eating and managing buttons & zips
Bikes and trikes / explore outdoor areas
Show accuracy when drawing
Explore using different body parts for movement, in different directions, at different levels and speeds
Manage personal hygiene

Literacy

Nursery & Reception

Enjoy making marks freely
Attribute meaning to the marks they make
Listening games, songs and rhymes
Recognise own name
Draw with increased accuracy

Reception

Learn set 1 sounds using Read, Write, Inc
Learn letter formation rhymes
Pencil grip

Maths Nursery

Sing number rhymes & count in play
Subitise to 3
Cardinal principle & correspondence to 5
Ordinality of numbers to 5

Reception

Sing number rhymes and count in everyday play
Ordinality and cardinality of numbers to 3, then 5, then 10
Link numeral to amount – 1:1 correspondence
Use of manipulatives such as Numicon to show understanding of number
Subitising to 3, then 5
Finger counting
Composition of number
Build with blocks and notice patterns
